SSN Grant: (AUD 7,500) "Immortalising organs: a feminist study of emerging placental technologies" – Dr Jaya Keaney (ADI), **A/P Neera Bhatia** (DLS), Dr Jacqueline Dalziell (UNSW), Dr Marnie Winter (Uni SA) and A/Prof Dominique Martin (Deakin School of Medicine). This project explores the ethical, legal, social, and cultural issues concerning micro physiological placental technologies and new placental research models that can be used during pregnancy to monitor and assist with conditions such as preeclampsia and foetal growth. We will investigate (i) shifting scientific understandings of the placenta (ii) explore emerging legal issues regarding placental organoids and placenta-on-chip technology and (iii) novel analysis of the cultural implications and notions of organs and reproductive bodies amongst other issues.
