Our relationship with you is a close one

This included a presentation from Deakin's Vice-Chancellor, Professor Iain Martin who spoke about the challenges facing the higher education sector, how Deakin continues to support students through COVID-19 and how Deakin will continue to prepare our students for the jobs of the future. Attendees also heard from Deakin University's Chair in Epidemiology, Professor Catherine Bennett who spoke about her experiences during COVID-19 last year. Deputy Vice-Chancellor Education, Professor Liz Johnson discussed how Deakin was well-placed to effectively respond to the challenges of 2020 and what the future of learning will look like in the coming years.

Changes to our Doctor of Medicine entry requirements

We have recently approved changes to the entry requirements for our **Doctor of Medicine**, relevant for applications into the 2022 cohort. The changes will mean that postgraduate qualifications, in addition to undergraduate qualifications, will now be recognised for the purpose of entry into the course.

Doctor of Medicine Rural Training Stream

We are excited to introduce our new **Rural Training Stream** (RTS) to the **Doctor of Medicine**. Beginning in 2022, the RTS is part of the School of Medicine's commitment to address the workforce needs and advance the health and wellbeing of regional, rural, remote, Indigenous and marginalised individuals and communities.

Around 30 existing Doctor of Medicine places will be allocated to the stream, which will help redress the shortfall of doctors in rural areas, by recruiting students into the course who live in a rural area and who commit themselves to undertaking their clinical training in a rural area.

Fourth residential college (Willem Yaluk) opens at the Deakin Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus

The latest building at Deakin Residential Services Geelong Waurn Ponds Campus features two components, a **fourth residential college**, Willem Yaluk (meaning river home to the local Indigenous Wadawurrung people), and a **village green** and **town hall**, which provides a central point for the larger residential precinct.

This fourth residential college comprises 320 student bedrooms and includes a large shared common area. The town hall holds up to 300 residents for larger scale events, and the village green, adjacent to the new reception building, is the perfect meeting point or place for residents to gather.
