What is it?

We are providing lower guaranteed ATARs for eligible students from under-represented cohorts, for most undergraduate courses. The Deakin Guaranteed ATAR is on average 10 points lower than the lowest selection rank for most courses. This will provide you with more certainty, reduce stress and ultimately give you greater opportunity to get into the course you really want.

Am I eligible?

The Deakin Guaranteed ATAR is open to Australian Year 12 students who meet one of the following criteria:

- attend a Deakin under-represented school
- live or study in a regional or remote home or school location
- are of Indigenous Australian descent.

It is important to check that you also meet course entry requirements, including any specific course prerequisites.

How to apply

You can apply for a course with a Deakin Guaranteed ATAR in a few simple steps:

1. Apply for your preferred Deakin courses through VTAC.
2. Remain opted-in for the 'personal information and location' category.
3. Review your application and submit.

The information captured in your VTAC application will be used to automatically check if you're eligible for the Deakin Guaranteed ATAR.

The Deakin Guaranteed ATAR is based on the ATAR you receive before any adjustments are made. This makes getting into the course you want even easier!

Interschool Moot Court Event – August 2026

Bringing law to life for senior students

For students considering a future in law, early exposure can make a meaningful difference. Mooting allows students to step beyond the classroom, build confidence and practical skills aligned with contemporary legal practice.

For career practitioners and teachers, Deakin's Interschool Moot Court offers a practical way to help students test their interest in law and explore pathways before they finalise senior subject and course choices.

Inside Deakin's 2026 Interschool Moot Court

Held on 11 and 13 August at Deakin's Burwood campus, the 2026 Interschool Moot Court places senior secondary students in the role of legal advocates, with the moot problem expected to explore contemporary issues in criminal law.

On day one, teams compete in two rounds of mooting and take part in workshops to strengthen legal argument and advocacy. A keynote speaker closes the day, with results announced ahead of the semi finals.

On day two, top performing teams progress through to the semi finals and final, judged by a practising judge. Across both days, students experience the pace and expectations of legal study in a supportive, school friendly setting.

Develop skills that support future law pathways

Mooting is widely recognised as one of the closest experiences to working in a courtroom before entering legal practice, helping students build advocacy, legal research, problem solving and persuasion skills while gaining insight into legal study and career pathways.

The initiative also bridges classroom learning and tertiary study. Students are introduced to the discipline required in legal education, including structured reasoning, attention to detail and the ability to construct and defend arguments under time constraints. This helps demystify law as a field of study and supports informed subject and career decision making.

For career practitioners, the program provides rich material for conversations about prerequisite subjects, study skills and the realities of legal careers.

Experiencing Deakin's purpose-built moot court

Deakin's Burwood campus provides a realistic learning environment through its purpose built moot court facilities, giving students a genuine sense of courtroom layout and procedure while they participate in simulated hearings.

Interschool Moot Court

Date: 11 and 13 August

Location: Melbourne Burwood Campus

Format: Two-day moot court competition, workshops and keynote

Year levels: Year 11 and Year 12

Capacity: Up to 50 teams (approx. 100–200 students)
