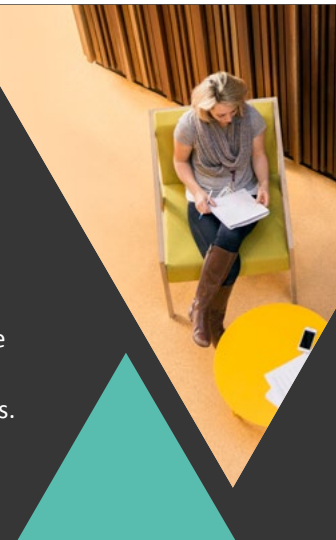

Deakin Accelerate

Deakin Accelerate is a distinctive VCE extension studies program that gives high-achieving students the opportunity to study two first-year university units alongside their Year 12 studies.

Benefits of Deakin Accelerate include:

- **An ATAR boost** – two subjects successfully completed in the program provide the same benefits of a fifth or sixth subject contributing to your students' ATAR result, but students also gain university credit and reduce the cost of their future degree.
- **Free and flexible** – there are no tuition fees as part of Deakin Accelerate; and students can choose to study at one of our campuses, online or a combination of both.
- **Earn university credit** – if the Accelerate units are related to the Deakin course enrolled in after graduating from secondary school, students gain credit. That's two units ticked off their degree. Even if the Deakin course is unrelated to the Accelerate units, in many cases students will still be able to gain credit by using those units as electives. This means you can lighten your first-year study load or fast-track your degree by going straight into second-year units.

- **An exciting enterprise educational program comes to you**



Business and Law Deputy Dean Kim Watty and Illuminate Education's Adam Mostogl with the illuminate:nextgen Challenge winners.

The Deakin Business School's support of the illuminate:nextgen Challenge is rolling out a new program to a limited number of schools in 2018. Instead of bringing students to campus, we will run the program in your school to allow as many students as possible to participate. Experienced facilitators will run the program alongside Deakin's leading academics who will visit your school.

What is the illuminate:nextgen Challenge program?

Students form teams of seven to develop a business plan, forecast financials, create marketing collateral and give an oral presentation with the support of Deakin University staff and industry professionals. On the final night of the challenge, students present their ideas to the public, showcase their trade displays and pitch design concepts to a panel of expert academics.

When is the program?

The program is designed to run across a five-day week, but to ensure as many students as possible can access the program, we can schedule it during a week that is most suitable to the school.

Who is the program aimed at?

The program is targeted at Year 10 students who are:

- Looking to study business-rated subjects in VCE
- interested in starting their own business one day
- considering university after Year 12
- dedicated and deserve the opportunity to develop their skills.

What is the cost of the program?

There is no cost associated with this program.

All students applying to an initial teacher education course are now required to take the CASPer test. CASPer is an online, video-scenario based situational judgement test, which is designed to measure non-academic suitability for teaching.

Bachelor of Medical Imaging

If your students do not meet the ATAR requirements for direct entry into the [Bachelor of Medical Imaging](#), one option they have is to select a different undergraduate course and apply for transfer at the end of first year. Keep in mind that the course prerequisites still apply and transfer into this course is competitive and based on a weighted average mark.

Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science

Students who do not meet the ATAR requirements for entry into the **Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science** may like to consider a **Bachelor of Health Sciences** with a major in exercise science.

Bachelor of Psychology (Honours)

Students who do not meet the ATAR requirements for entry into the **Bachelor of Psychology (Honours)** may like to consider the **Bachelor of Psychological Science** or the **Bachelor of Health Sciences** with a major in psychological science.

Bachelor of Nursing and Midwifery

Students who do not meet the ATAR requirements for entry into the **Bachelor of Nursing/Bachelor of Midwifery** can consider the **Bachelor of Nursing**. Upon successful completion of the Bachelor of Nursing and their graduate year, students can then apply for entry into the Graduate Diploma of Midwifery.

► **#1 sport science school in the world for the second year running!**

Deakin's School of Exercise and Nutrition Sciences has cemented its position as the world's best, being ranked #1 sport science school in the world for the second year running.*

Our field-leading Bachelor of Exercise and Sport Science is the first and longest-standing nationally accredited undergraduate exercise and sport science program in Victoria. Our graduates are eligible to apply for accreditation with Exercise and Sports Science Australia (ESSA) as an Accredited Exercise Scientist (AES).

It is the only course in exercise and sport science that enables students to tailor their learning around a particular interest or career goal. Our majors allow students to specialise in strength and conditioning, exercise physiology, sport coaching, applied sport science, physical activity and health, and other areas.

The course also gives students access to industry connections and practical experience through learning partnerships with some of Victoria's top sporting organisations, including the Geelong Cats, Melbourne Boomers, Victorian Institute of Sport and VicHealth.

► **Deakin University's VCE Physical Education School Visits Program**

Turning theory into practice

Deakin's School of Exercise and Nutrition Sciences offers VCE Physical Education classes the opportunity to gain an insight into exercise science testing and evaluation in a laboratory or clinical environment at our Melbourne Burwood Campus.

The program offers physical education teachers a great opportunity to reinforce aspects of the VCE curriculum, using Deakin's world-class performance laboratories. Two separate laboratory experiences are offered that link to Unit 1 (The Human Body in Motion) and Unit 4 (Training to Improve Performance) of the VCE Physical Education curriculum.

It is a 120-minute program, with students interacting with sport scientists, while conducting and interpreting a range of laboratory tests. Each lab has been designed as a complete laboratory report, which can be used as an assessment task. Schools may choose one or both of the laboratory sessions, as well as take a tour of other facilities within the University.

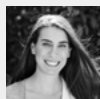
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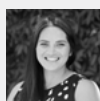
