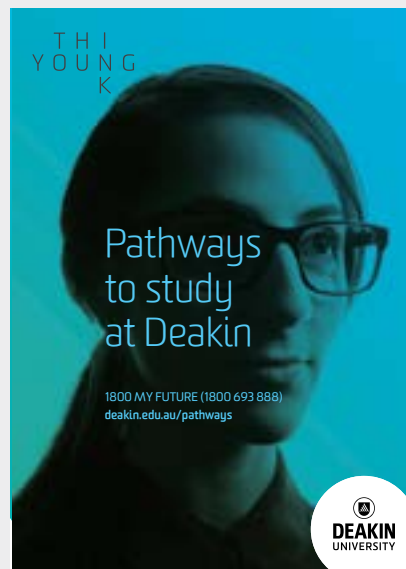

BioLab: The Winning Edge @ Deakin

BioLAB is a Victorian education centre that aims to engage and inspire the next generation in science and mathematics.

The centre runs a highly popular program for students in Years 10–12 called The Winning Edge at our Geelong Waurrn Ponds Campus. The program is designed to give students a hands-on introduction to university and research-level anatomy, physiology and biomechanics. The program is a wonderful introduction to exercise, health and medical science career pathways. Students get to experience cutting edge technologies allowing them to measure force, gait analysis, predictive VO2 max and power. They use anatomical terms and models to further investigate the human body.

Key themes: Anatomy, physiology, biomechanics, career pathways.

Dates: the program runs in specific weeks in Terms 1, 2, and 3.

Suitable for: Year 10–12 (VCE Physical Education Units 1–4)

Program duration: 3.5 hours

International students applying to study undergraduate courses in the disciplines of architecture and built environment, engineering, information technology, science or environment are encouraged to apply for the Deakin Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Scholarship. Recipients will receive a 20% reduction in tuition fees. Academic eligibility for VTAC international students is published ATAR +5.
