Keynotes

Diana Oblinger - Education and IT: Game Changers: What it Means for Deakin

How can we reach more learners, more effectively, and with greater impact? Education changes lives and societies, but can we sustain the current model? New models and new technologies allow us to rethink many of the premises of education—location and time, credits and credentials, knowledge creation and sharing. Find out who is changing the game and what we can learn from the different approaches which are shaping educational futures internationally and here at Deakin.

Diana G. Oblinger is president and CEO of EDUCAUSE, a nonprofit association whose mission is to advance higher education through the use of information technology. Previously, Oblinger held positions in academia and business, including vice president for information resources and chief information officer for the University of North Carolina system, executive director of higher education for Microsoft, and IBM director of the Institute for Academic Technology.

Omar Musa: Education and the Voice of Change

If knowledge is power then education can be the pathway to empowerment, particularly for those far from the centres of power in society. Musician, author and award winning poet Omar Musa takes us to the public role of education as an instrument for social change and equality. On the crest of global uncertainty, education's promise and responsibility is to give voice to the wordless and to help learners forge a pathway to a better place.

Omar Musa won the Australian Poetry Slam in 2008 and the Indian Ocean Poetry Slam in 2009. He has released two solo hip hop records (*The Massive EP* and *World Goes to Pieces*), two self published books (*The Clocks* and *Parang*) and a self titled album with international hip hop group *MoneyKat*. He is set to publish his debut novel *Here Come the Dogs* through Penguin Books (Australia) in 2013.

Workshops
